### 4. Chairman's Report:

#### 7. VP's Report:

- What was the Committee view about when the works should be done? Are you happy
  for the Contractor to carry out during the Season, or would you prefer to wait until we
  have some down time in playing? We will take advice from the Contractors once they
  start looking at this to see what they can feasibly do within a Live Club setting.
- Discussion is needed on Finances and understanding on what building cashflow requirements vs available funds.

It was felt the ideal start time for the works would be Feb/March with a view to completion in time for the Awards day. However we will need to wait for the tenders before making a final decision.

To date 150 bricks have been sold and £5400 received from CrowdFunder. The scheme cannot be re-run but remains open. Once the work has been agreed it was felt that sales of bricks would pick up again.

#### 14. Club Development:

a) Safeguarding – all coaches need to complete the relevant courses before September. Query whether if we visit Somerset do we need to advise the RFU. The tour/tournament organiser is responsible to do this.

#### 15. AOB:

- b) Many of the training posts are broken. Ayo to buy some new spikes for them.
- c) RFU courses fixed for 8<sup>th</sup> September. Agreed the next Committee meeting be brought forward to 1<sup>st</sup> September.
- d) Chris will ask Lewis for better access to GMS so he is able to do a better breakdown of memberships.
- e) Pressure washer required for grilles in kitchen. Probably able to use Palmers.
- f) Guy suggested Barracudas be asked to buy a new cylinder for the BBQ in return for free use next year. Agreed.
