Club Safeguarding Policy 2020-2021

- 1. Bridport Rugby Football Club (BRFC) acknowledges its responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children involved in BRFC from harm.
- BRFC confirms that it adheres to the Rugby Football Union's (RFU)
 <u>Safeguarding Policy and the Procedures</u>, pracGces and guidelines and endorse and adopt the Policy Statement contained in that document and any successor policy.
- 3. A child is anyone under the age of 18 engaged in any rugby union acGvity. However, where a 17 year old male player is playing in the adult game it is essenGal that every reasonable precauGon is taken to ensure his safety and wellbeing are protected.
- 4. The Key Principles of the RFU Safeguarding Policy are that:
- The welfare of the child is, and must always be, paramount to any other consideraGons.
- All parGcipants regardless of age, gender, ability or disability, race, faith, culture, size, shape, language or sexual idenGty have the right to protecGon from abuse or harm.
- All allegaGons or suspicions of abuse, neglect, harm and poor pracGce will be taken seriously and responded to swiSly, fairly and appropriately.

- Working in partnership with other organisaGons, statutory agencies, parents, carers, children and young people is essenGal for the welfare of children.
- Children have a right to expect support, and personal and social development delivered by an appropriately recruited, veZed and managed in relaGon to their parGcipaGon in rugby union, whether they are playing, volunteering or officiaGng in the community or professional areas of the sport.
- 5. BRFC recognises that all children have the right to parGcipate in sport in a safe, posiGve and enjoyable environment whilst at the same Gme being protected from abuse, neglect, harm and poor pracGce. BRFC recognises that this is the responsibility of everyone involved, in whatever capacity, at the club.
- 6. BRFC will implement and comply with the RFU Code of Conduct <u>BRFC</u> Code of Conduct, <u>BRFC Player Code of Conduct</u> and the Codes of Conduct for Coaches, Spectators and Officials as appropriate. <u>RFU Age Grade Rugby Codes</u> of PracGce
- 7. The Club Safeguarding Officer is: Niamh Vercoe, 07901 703973, niamhvercoe81@yahoo.co.uk. If you witness or are aware of an incident where the welfare of a child has been put at risk you must, in the first instance, inform the Club

Safeguarding Officer. They will then inform the CB (consGtuent body is Dorset & Wilts RFU) Safeguarding Manager and the RFU Safeguarding Team. - 8. All members of BRFC who work with children in Regulated AcGvity must undertake an RFU Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check in accordance with RFU RegulaGon 21
- 9. BRFC will ensure that all its members, whether they are coaches, parents, players or officials will comply with the Best PracGce Guidance (page 18-24 of Safeguarding Policy booklet) as issued by the RFU. In summary, the following are NOT acceptable and will be treated seriously by the club and may result in disciplinary acGon being taken by the club, the CB or the RFU:
- Working alone with a child.
- Consuming alcohol whilst responsible for children.
- Providing alcohol to children or allowing its supply.
- Smoking in the presence of children.
- HumiliaGng children.
- Inappropriate or unnecessary physical contact with a child.
- ParGcipaGng in, or allowing, contact or physical games with children.
- Having an inGmate or sexual relaGonship with any child developed as a result of being in a 'posiGon of trust.'
- Making sexually explicit comments or sharing sexually explicit material.
- Taking or sharing photographs / videos of children / players without parental or BRFC consent.

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- 11. BRFC manages the changing faciliGes and arranges for them to be supervised by two DBS checked adults of the appropriate gender for the players using the faciliGes. BRFC ensures that all its coaches, parents, officials and spectators are aware that adults must not change at the same Gme, using the same faciliGes as children.
- 12. BRFC will ensure that its coaches [and team managers] will receive the support and training considered appropriate to their posiGon and role. The RFU "Managing Challenging Behaviour" Policy has been adopted and circulated amongst the club workforce both, voluntary and paid. BRFC Managing Challenging Behaviour
- 13. Any events held on BRFC premises must comply with this Policy and if appropriate a Safeguarding Plan should be discussed and circulated to those affected. Any tours, overseas or domesGc, undertaken by BRFC must comply with the relevant RFU RegulaGons and Guidance Touring with Children relaGng to tours.
- 14. BRFC has a Whistleblowing policy. You can raise concerns with your coach, manager or **any** club official. However, where a maZer is more serious, or you feel that your concerns have not been addressed, or you prefer not to raise it with your coach, manager, or club official then different alternaGves exist. See full policy on website and noGceboard.
- 15. This policy statement should be read in conjuncGon with other documents and codes which form BRFC comprehensive policy approach to safeguarding. Other documents can be found on the clubs website www.bridportrugby.co.uk and clubhouse noGce board.
